Future building plans

We have several plans in the pipeline for construction in different schools.

- An agriculture block on Damson's farm in Limbe, Malawi to assist the teaching of the agriculture syllabus.
- The construction of a vocational block at Morning Star Academy, Nakuru, Kenya, to bring the school in line with the new curriculum requirements. It is hoped that this will be a project that people from the UK can volunteer to help build.
- Having bought the land in Kakubansiri, Lugazi, Uganda, we now need to put up a school hall that will double up as three classrooms. This will enable the school to finally be registered with the government.
- The first floor labs and classrooms at Hope Christian High School in Lugazi, Uganda.

Of course, all these are on hold until the covid-19 virus is out of the way. The Hope in Africa Trustees need wisdom as to proceed with the projects both financially and with timing for volunteers. It will take some time for the schools we support to get back to any sort of normal.
